### **DISASTER RELIEF**

Thank you to all who made it possible for delivery of two RVs to families in need in western North Carolina. Some funds were used for delivery cost and some for purchase of a used trailer. Mike Sanchez of A/M Automotive in Youngstown, NY, delivered the trailers to the Asheville area.

#### **FACILITY REPAIRS**

Repairs to the foundation of the Tallman Cabin have been completed and a steel roof installed. Leaks in the roofs of the Draper Building and Memorial Pavilion continue to get attention. The former horse barn which stores the tractor and lawn mowers has been resided with metal siding, doors were added to enclose it and a metal roof installed. Electrical line to it is not yet done but planned.

Substantial repairs to the siding on the Draper are necessary as soon as possible. The basketball court needs to be repayed as soon as funds allow.

#### TIMBER MANAGEMENT

CHC has had a long-standing interest in good forest management. Harvest of timber and culling unhealthy trees has been productive for optimum growth of timber and has benefited Camp financially. Steve and Bonnie Andrews have been consulted to assess current forest conditions and plan for an appropriate timber harvest.
